# Consultation on the future of **Hameldon Community College**

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## Introduction

Lancashire County Council, and the governors of Hameldon Community College, have agreed to hold a public consultation on the future of the school, including its proposed closure.

This was decided at a meeting of the County Council's Cabinet held on Thursday 10 August 2017.

There are many reasons why this consultation was believed to be in the best interests of the school and its pupils. More detail about each of the reasons will be outlined in the document, but I'll summarise them here.

Despite considerable efforts over many years to support the school, it has still faced significant challenges. The number of pupils has reduced each year and there are now fewer than 300 pupils in a school built for 750. The school has faced problems in raising attainment, falling significantly below the required minimum standards.

The school's budget has also reduced because it has fewer pupils, which in turn has caused staffing problems, reduced subject options and lowered pupil results.

Significant additional support has been provided by Lancashire County Council since 2008, but despite this the school has not been able to maintain any improvements that have been made at various times.

Lancashire County Council has a statutory duty to provide high-quality school places for all of our children. Duty aside, we are absolutely committed to providing all our pupils with the education they deserve. Because of this commitment, we have to look very closely at all of our options for those pupils who are currently attending, or are thinking of attending Hameldon Community College in the future, to make sure that they receive the best possible education. The formal consultation period will run from 11 September 2017 until 20 October 2017.

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During this period we will seek the views of parents and carers, pupils, staff, governors and other interested parties on how we can provide the best possible education for the young people in this area. We'll make sure that you receive the information you need to make up your mind on what you think the future of the school should be, including the measures we would put in place to ensure that our existing pupils enjoy a high-quality education.

An event will also be held at the school as part of the consultation. I hope that you will take the opportunity to attend and ask us any questions you have about the future of the school.

No decisions have yet been taken. Feedback from the consultation will be taken to Lancashire County Council's Cabinet meeting in December, and will be considered there.

I urge you to let us have your views. The views you share with us about any possible alternative options for the school will be used to shape the decisions that need to be taken. Most importantly, by doing this you'll help us to provide the best education we can for young people in this area.

# What is the proposal?

To consult on the future of Hameldon Community College, with effect from 31 August 2018. Any changes would be managed in the best interests of pupils, whose education is our highest priority

- Lancashire County Council, with the governors of Hameldon Community College, will consider all of the ideas received through the consultation to identify potential future options.
- Consideration will be given to whether high standards of education for pupils can be achieved by closing the school, and making alternative provision for current and future pupils at other local schools.

# The purpose of the consultation

We want to gather as many practical ideas as possible on the future of Hameldon Community College, to inform the decision making process of Lancashire County Council's cabinet at its meeting in December. This is your opportunity to:

- Seek clarification on the process;
- Raise any issues that will impact on you, which you would like us to look at further;
- Put forward any alternative practical proposals; and
- Ask us any questions.

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The results of the consultation will help councillors to decide on the future of the school.

It's important to remember that the purpose of the consultation is to inform councillors.

# The reasons why we are holding a consultation

#### Ofsted inspection

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The most recent Ofsted inspection of the school took place in July 2015, rating the school as Requires Improvement. This is in spite of significant additional support received by the school since 2008.

#### Numbers of pupils attending

The number of pupils attending the school has been falling for some years. It has experienced a 14% decline in the numbers on roll and a 34% decrease on intake to Year 7 over the last five years. The latest figures, from January 2017, show that the school had 296 pupils on roll, in a school built for 750.

The reality is that the school is currently 60% empty and this looks set to continue, as only 35 pupils have expressed an interest in joining the school in September 2017. There are between 85 and 98 places left unfilled in each year group at the school.

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It is recommended that secondary schools have at least 600 pupils, so that there is a sustained staffing structure that can deliver a diverse and quality curriculum. This decline in pupil numbers means that the school is currently educationally and financially at risk.

#### **Financial position**

The decline in pupil numbers has in turn led to a reduction in the school's budget. The impact of this has resulted in the school's costs being higher than its income for a number of years. This is likely to worsen over the next few years.

Fewer pupils attending the school will also mean that the school will receive less money in the future.

Schools by law must set a balanced budget. Unfortunately, the school isn't expected to be able to do this, which means that it is no longer financially viable.

#### **Educational standards**

Lancashire County Council has both a legal duty and a commitment to provide high-quality school places. Pupils at Hameldon Community College are currently not receiving a broad and balanced curriculum, and this cannot continue.

The educational standards achieved by pupils at the school have varied over the last five years, with standards only above the Government's minimum standards in two of these years. The school is also below the new 2016 'Progress 8' standard, placing the school in the bottom 3% nationally.

Although a high proportion of pupils are from disadvantaged backgrounds, their progress doesn't reach the Government's minimum requirement and does not compare favourably against pupils at other Lancashire schools of similar ability.

Fewer pupils attending the school means that it receives less money, which impacts on the school's ability to deliver effective education to its pupils.

#### Leadership and teaching

The school does not have permanent leadership arrangements in place currently and has had to rely on a number of consultant part-time headteachers.

The school has also struggled to recruit and retain good teachers, particularly in subjects such as mathematics, and has had to rely on a high number of temporary supply teachers to fill staffing gaps. Over half of the teaching staff are employed on a daily supply basis, which has an impact upon the curriculum they are able to offer, the quality of teaching, pupil behaviour and ultimately on academic results.

#### Multi-academy trust

There have been many attempts over a number of years to find a suitable academy sponsor for the school to enable it to become part of a multi-academy trust (MAT). This has not been successful.

#### Additional support

Lancashire County Council has been providing significant extra support for the school since 2008. This has included both time and professional resources.

Despite these efforts, the school has not been able to maintain any improvements.

#### The governing body

Hameldon Community College's governing body has expressed concern about the situation at the school. Despite the support that the school has received from the county council, standards have still fallen, and the governors asked that the long-term future of the school be considered.

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#### The current position

Whatever the outcome of this consultation, Lancashire County Council will continue to work closely with Hameldon Community College, ensuring that resources are in place to continue to provide an education to its pupils.

# Places available at alternative local schools

The availability of other school places in the area is an important consideration.

The table on the next page shows the total number of places (PAN) available at Burnley schools, and their available capacity for 11-16 year olds (Net Cap). These figures are based on the pupil numbers in each year group, as at January 2017.

# How this proposal will affect pupils at the school

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We urge you to let us have your views on the future of Hameldon Community College, including its possible closure.

If the decision were taken for the school to close, the best interests of each pupil would be our priority, including making sure that they were able to start at a different school for the start of the 2018/19 academic year. All parents of pupils in Years 7 to 10 will be contacted with the guaranteed offer of a place at an alternative school. Pupils currently in Year 11 will be unaffected by this proposal as they will have left school by the time any proposals are implemented.

Parents would also able to express a preference for their child to attend any other local school, as long as places were available. Lancashire County Council's pupil access team will be available to offer information and advice throughout this process. ۲

### Key considerations

The results of the consultation will inform the decision by councillors on Lancashire County Council's Cabinet on whether to take this proposal to the next stage. In coming to a decision, the Cabinet will need to consider:

- Whether young people have access to the broad and balanced curriculum they are entitled to receive
- Whether there are enough high-quality school places in the future in this area
- Use of resources and financial sustainability

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# **Consultation event**

An important part of the consultation will be an event held at the school on 11 October 2017 from 3pm to 8pm. 


