The money from the grant would assist us to buy all furniture, garden planters, water feature, plants and sensory garden ornaments required to create this special space for many children at school. It would also include the labour from a local company to assist in setting up the features and securing them in place.

Benefits of a sensory garden

A sensory garden is a carefully designed planting area where plants and features are displayed or grown to please all of the five senses – sight, sound, taste, touch, smell.

We experience everything through our senses and this creates the multi sensory memory we carry with us through life.

The more senses we engage the richer the experience. Sensory gardens can be passive places designed to be calming while other designs can be more stimulating and educational. The garden will be open to all children in school to enjoy, who largely come from the local community.

Educational

Considerable learning can be achieved by children being allowed to explore their senses with an interactive hands on approach.

Encourages explorative and discovery skills.

Supports cognitive development.

Promotes bodily awareness.

Pastoral care

Time spent in natural environments can provide benefits to emotional and physical health. They can be beautiful places to relax, reflect, contemplate and talk

Our school aims to provide effective support to children to ensure their well being and personal and social needs are met. A sensory garden would provide a therapeutic and calming environment for pastoral care to take place.

SEND

How our brains receive and process sensory information can greatly affect the everyday things we are able to do. The neurological process that takes place to organise the sensation from body or environment is what makes it possible for a child to effectively use their body within their environment.

A purposely designed garden can help engage children with sensory development needs and can provide a safe place to develop communication and language skills, promote self awareness, and assist them to interpret the subtle differences between the senses.

Recreation

The garden area can be integrated into the school playground so it can be enjoyed by all during playtime. It will enable our children to engage with the environment in a fun way developing positive attitudes, social skills and self esteem.

Having an area for quiet play can help with a sense of social cohesion and emotional growth, Providing a new area for interaction with friends that hasn't previously been available at school.

4.10 Please give a detailed breakdown of your expenditure for your activity/equipment.

We require 25 varieties of plants costing between £5 and £7 per plant - costed from Coblands online plant supplier and includes varieties such as honeysuckle, heuchera, herbs, grasses, hebes, acer to give a full range of sensory experiences. Total cost for plants £175.

We require compost at a cost of £50.

We would plant bulbs for repeated flowering each year at a cost of £20.

The seating areas include a large corner arbour from DFE furniture for schools costing £395 and a junior coloured bench for £165.

The planters include a hexagonal herb container from Wickes costing £90, raised log planters x3 also from Wickes at a price of £65 each (total £195) and 2 rustic timber framed raised beds from Savoy timber at £25 each (total £50).

We would require 2 lots of brushwood screening from Wickes costing £19 each (total £38).

Also 2 square trellis sections from Savoy at a cost of £11 each (total £22).

The sensory decorations from disability aids website include giant hand mirrors £33, outdoor bubble mirror £90 and a 25 piece windmill sensory set costing £128.

In addition we would like to include a water feature that does not need linking into mains water supply and does not hold standing water but has a constant flow - these come in a variety of designs and cost approximately £200. A particular type has not yet been selected as we are clarifying health and safety features and maintenance.

The total cost of plants, furniture and decorations as listed above is £1,651.

Labour is estimated at a cost of a further £300. We anticipate this being supplemented by volunteers.
