## DELAYED TRANSFERS OF CARE CHALLENGE



- Leadership to communicate the 'single system / single process' message
- Importance of sustainable relationships and collaboration at all levels, and across a wide range of agencies (including primary care, community services, local health and wellbeing partnerships, district councils, VCFS)



- Implement the Stranded Patient / DTOC solutions identified by Newtons Europe across whole Lancashire South Cumbria (L&SC) system
- Identify a group of highly skilled officers with sufficient capacity to take this work forward, their sole focus on implementation (i.e. no other 'day' job), working across organisational and health economy boundaries



- Standardise language, metrics, data sharing, processes and offer across whole L&SC system
- Standardise and implement a small number of key pathways across L&SC, to include the VCFS, care sector, community based non-medical 'offers' e.g. frail elderly pathway
- What can we do differently and at scale? .... innovate / 'new age' solutions / digital

- Utilise other networks including STP workstreams, A&E DBs and Urgent & Emergency Care Network appropriately, as part of 'whole system' approach
- Adopt and implement learning about what's working elsewhere



 Link up more effectively at neighbourhood level, engaging wider primary care workforce such as GPs, pharmacists, dentists, community services E.g. GP & pharmacy support to care homes
