SCHOOLS AND LANCASHIRE SACRE Youth SACRE Phase 3

Note of Teachers' Meeting which took place on 11 July 2012 at Broughton High

Present: Joanne Harris [Broughton High], Claire Elliott [Penwortham Girls High School], Marissa Donaghue [All Hallows High, Penwortham], Kim Murden [Worden Sports College], Kate Murray [The Hollins Technology College] Helen Harrison [RE Consultant to Lancashire SACRE]

Original Outcomes updated/evaluated/action

an area suggested by students during last meeting

- Create a genuine Youth Voice to advise the SACRE in its duty to support RE throughout Lancashire County Schools – *Inform rather than advise at the* moment HH
 - HH to send SACRE Development Plan to schools for students to consider.
- Establish a bridge with RE departments via students working with the SACRE/each other and their schools in a proactive manner eg through action research – going well as the June meeting proved. Schools to continue with projects and approach other Y SACRE schools to help their research.
- Raise the profile of RE in schools, the County and nationally- *sporadic and haphazard progress.* Y SACRE to ask to address LASSH. EW [with the support of HH] to write an article to be published in RE Today. Rota of schools established to write a report from different meetings/events to be put on SACRE site. Youth Conference 2013 to disseminate projects?
- Promoting understanding between people from different backgrounds and beliefs. *Fully achieved and ongoing.*
- Develop life skills. All agreed particular strength.
- Contribute to the development of the Lancashire Syllabus/RE including through exploring aspects of enquiry. Ongoing – Broughton and Ashton focusing on this area. Both schools to provide materials to go on the syllabus site.
- Consider ways of relating RE to the Government target of developing the 'Big Society' Remove as we still are not sure what the BS is.
- Consider and help identify RE's contribution to Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural Education [SMSC] – a strong area for us, schools already evidencing how this has been of value for their schools during Ofsted. An area for Y SACRE to take forward next year.

Other issues arising

- Group agreed that Fearns would be welcome to join them Andrea Shackleton. The school had requested this when phase 3 started but did not have capacity.
- Change the name Lancashire SACRE Youth Voice [LSYV] to reflect its actual function take this to SACRE.
- HH to ask SACRE to help raise the profile of the project within the schools by sending letters to Head Teachers/Governors and certificates to the students involved [we have done this previously HH to see if a copy can be found].
- KM shared the Hollins' project 'The Community Cube' and suggested ways it could link with Y SASCRE's work.
- Agreed there must be continuity of students attending meetings but acknowledged the need for rolling groups. Make up of groups – Ashton 4 students Year 8 [cont from Y7], Broughton 6 Y9 students, Penwortham girls 4 [?] Y 8 students, Worden 6 Y 8 students, All Hallows Y9s and 7s, Hollins Y8 [from a larger group].
- Students also suggested creating a travelling exhibition, linking to primary schools, create resource/picture banks to put on line.
