

The Current reality

- The cost of domestic abuse in Lancashire is £157,213,638
- April 2006 March 2007 there were 19,274 incidents of domestic abuse, from April 2010 to March 2011, there were 27,614 incidents an increase of 43%
- Domestic abuse now constitutes nearly a 1/3 of all violent crime in Lancashire, and is linked to almost 70% of all child protection cases.
- Only 5 % of referrals in to MARACs come from the NHS (Primary, Secondary, Mental Health, and Substance Misuse)
- £3 million funding concentrates at the criminal justice end of the problem need to shift this if we are to 'break the cycle'

- Ensure support is appropriate, and services are available to reduce the level of risk
- Ensure that all partners adopt a whole system approach to reduce domestic abuse, not just focus services at the top of the triangle
