Background and Advice

The External Scrutiny Committee at its meeting on 5 March 2019 received a rapporteur report from County Councillor Gillian Oliver on Universal Credit following a bite size briefing delivered by the Welfare Rights Service Manager. It was agreed that the committee should undertake a review on the roll out of Universal Credit across Lancashire.

Lisa Scullion, Professor of Social Policy at the University of Salford will attend the meeting to deliver a presentation on learning lessons from lived experiences of Universal Credit.

Professor Scullion was involved in a collaborative five year study focusing on the impact of welfare conditionality, which included a specific focus on experiences of Universal Credit. The findings from this research are available from the Welfare Conditionality website¹. Research on veterans' experiences within the social security
