How did the project come about?

- Approach made by a Dental Practice within Rossendale raising concerns that not many children had returned after pandemic
- Opportunity identified for some collaboration between CCG's, Children's Social Care and Dental Practices
- Dental assessment data at its lowest
- A chance to make a real difference for our children and "do things differently"
- Links with Health Inequalities Agenda (and funding)
- Something that no other Local Authority is doing......well, not like us

Some interesting facts about Dental Practices

- Payment by results
- Work in isolation to the wider Dental Network – no transferring of information between practices (start again syndrome)
- No sharing of data or information in place

 do not know legal status of children
- Knowledge of children in care limited but keen to learn more
- Patients are no longer "registered" with dentists, they are now "known" to their dentist

What are the aims and objectives of the Pilot?

- To improve access for our children to a dentist, dental assessment and dental treatment
- To improve communication between foster carers, dentists, social workers, health professionals
- To address the impact of COVID and prioritise our children
- To support real time recording
- To improve oral health outcomes for our children
- Promote and facilitate positive experiences of accessing dental care that can be carried into adulthood

How will the Pilot meets its aims and objectives?

Improved access

Identification of children in our care

Increased awareness to foster carers, residential staff, connected carers, IRO's, supervising social workers

Improved communication

Referral and contact paperwork (completed by dentists)

Prioritising our children

Financial incentives

Real time recording

Promote and facilitate positive experiences



Where is the Pilot happening? Who with? When?

• Lancashire children who live with foster carers, connected carers, in residential homes, or with parents subject to a Care Order in Rossendale

- Looked After children who move in to live in Rossendale (foster care, residential care, connected carers, care order at home)
- Covers nominated NHS dental practices in the Rossendale area
- Children in that cohort that have an NHS dentist
- Children in that cohort who are not registered with an NHS dentist
- Started on 20 September



Next steps.....

Lessons learnt from the Rossendale Pilot rolled out across the whole the Lancashire and South Cumbria footprint

- Formal evaluation of the Project by Post Graduate student from UCI and NHSE/I
- Foster carer feedback obtained to inform evaluation.
- Children's feedback of their experience gained via ipads in the dentipractice immediately following their appointment
- Feedback from professionals involved (CLA admin, social workers, fc carers, IRO etc) about how they feel the pilot has worked, and any a that could be improved
