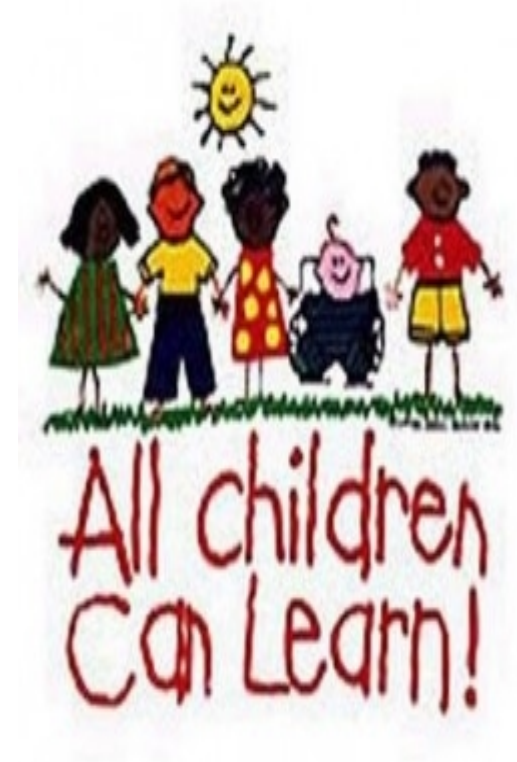

Employment Support

- Despite the ongoing impact of Covid and reduction in available apprenticeships, the number of young people supported into employment by the Employment Support Team increased in 2021/22 to 103 from 82 in the previous year.
- Employment and Support Team developed their own Employability programme in 2021/22 with online lessons each week.
- Asdan and AQA qualifications accessed through Leaving Care service.
- Housing Project will support young people to develop skills, confidence, training and employment opportunities.
- Implementation of the EET Strategy and Action Plan

Examples of employment journeys

- C started in 2018 on a level 2 Apprenticeship now nearly completed his level 3 and secured a Grade 4 permanent role in Lancashire County Council.
- J started her Care Apprenticeship in a Lancashire County Council care home in 2019. She has recently secured permanent work in care home and hopes to get her Apprentice results soon.
- D was supported through Lancashire County Council and then a private sector company whilst overcoming several barriers to now this year has completed his degree which he achieved a 2:1 and now working in his preferred career.
- L started at the Household Recycling plant and has secured permanent work and worked hard on industry specific qualifications.
- B started in 2019 on an engineering Apprenticeship and the company have now moved from Employment and Support Team funded to employing him directly without our support.
