




Lancashire Better Care Fund Reset

Metrics And Performance

Metric	February Data - Lancashire	February Data - Average All HWB Areas	Lancashire Change from December Position
Discharge to Usual Place of Residence (from hospital)	87.28%	92.52%	
Length of Stay (Hospital) 14 days	15.66%	11.78%	
Length of Stay (Hospital) 21 days	9%	6.39%	



Adult Social Care Discharge Fund

- Discharge grant was spent in full by both the Local Authority and the ICB
- 'End of Year Summary' submission by 2nd May 2023.

 4. Maintaining the NHS's contribution to adult social care (in line with the uplift to the NHS minimum contribution to the BCF), and investment in NHS commissioned out of hospital services
