1.1 Enable effective clustering activity in support of the National Cyber Force at Samlesbury

Delivery Lead: Andy Walker, LCC

Board Sponsors: TBC

This work is being led by Andy Walker at LCC.

(No update since May 23):

Recent good progress on confirming timelines with NCF has given local thematic work and renewed focus and impetus. Additional headroom in the LEPs 23/24 budget is also allowing us to actively pursue and resource work closely aligned with the Innovation Plan specifically the detailed business case and design of the Samlesbury Innovation Hub and renewed work to re-animate the Industrial Collaboration workstream.

1.2 Catalyse spin-offs from Lancashire universities, and 'spin-ins' from outside the County

Delivery Lead: Dion William, Lancaster University Board Sponsors: Dion Williams, Lancaster University

This action is being led by Dion William on behalf of the Lancashire Universities # spin-offs from Lancashire universities

(No update since May 23):

- Pulling together nationally comparable data on university IP commercialisation and student/grad start-ups from the Higher Education Business & Community Interaction Survey (HEBCIS) a statutory annual return to Research England completed by all UK universities, plus relevant data from the Knowledge Exchange Framework;
- LU IP Team pulling together latest reports re Uni IP Commercialisation best practice from relevant bodies including Government, Praxis-Auril, etc. There is a new review just announced around University IP commercialisation that we will actively engage with;
- Once above compiled we will organise a cross-HE workshop and discussion;
- Led with Matt Wright and support from UCLan on a LEP/County focused bid into InnovateUK Launchpad call before Xmas 22 - £7M that if successful could be



- leveraged against this item. Decision was due before end of 2022 but now we are told 'the spring';
- LU led a £5M bid recently into the EPSRC's Place Based Impact Acceleration Account call which if successful will also align. This proposal was focused on innovation across the NW Cyber Corridor to support relevant public and private sector organisations large and small in the cyber cluster and aligned regional sectors including aerospace, defence, advanced manufacturing, energy including nuclear, etc. UCLan and Cumbria University are partners on the proposal and if successful we will also engage Edge Hill;
- In the last week there was a pre-announcement of a call under Research England's Connecting Capabilities Fund with a focus on university commercialisation – we will review when further details are announced and consider a Lancashire-wide call involving other HE partners;
- In aligned good new Lancaster will be signing off on our biggest ever spin-out investment in the next couple of weeks, over £5M.
- 1.3 Improve the availability of attractive, digitally enabled, flexible grow-on office space in city/town centres

(No update since May 23):

This is currently being developed add hoc including:

- -Advancing discussions for a Lancashire Innovation Hub, potentially at Samlesbury with a Preston touch down site too.
- -Providing expertise around innovation and technology focussed businesses to support proposals for development around Preston Station.
- -Continuing to optimise the impact of Fraser House Hub in Lancaster and developing a service to share best practice with town deals and other programmes where innovation / collaboration spaces are being developed.

Future plans:

-When additional staff are in place we will begin audits of each local area to assess what collaboration and grow on space is available in each area. This will start with a collation of existing reports, and extend to commissioning new studies if necessary. £ average (and median / quartiles) price for sqft office space

1.4 Define detailed Smart Specialisation strategy

This work is led by StJohn Crean at the University of Central Lancashire.

Matthew Guest at UCLan and Maya Ellis have begun scoping this work. We are looking at building on Steer's initial Smart Specialisation paper to create a fairly simple but powerful approach to prioritising smart specialisation in Lancashire. We will aim to bring a paper on this to the November board, but in principle it looks like agreeing 3-5 key smart specialisation areas and then getting agreement from all major delivery programmes to prioritise these when making decisions about project development. For example, they may form an additional criteria / priority for future skills bootcamp calls, and also we may prioritise these areas for creating collateral within our marketing strategy.

1.5 Secure external funding to help strengthen Lancashire's innovation ecosystem. (Partnerships & resource generation)

(No update since May)

- -A number of bids are in process or awaiting outcome, detailed further in 3.1.
- -In addition, the sector groups of the main LEP board have identified a need for more bid identification and writing resource, so there is a proposal to invest in further resource in this space shortly which will cross into the innovation space also.
- -We are speaking to Felicity Jones to do some consultancy work around developing a model for how best to support and develop private sponsorship and support for the Innovation Plan work. There is resource within the innovation plan for a staff role to lead on this work. The consultancy will support work the develop exactly what this role needs to look like.
- -As part of their feasibility work on a potential Innovation Hub at Samlesbury, Plexal have also shared best practice on how they have developed their innovation ecosystem work in London, particularly around partnership development. We are now incorporating that expertise into the development of the Innovation Plan.

has still not been decided, a decision was expected at

- successful. Manchester won the only such bid in the NW for a materials related project. A further round is due to which we can apply.
- Liaison with NP11 who have commissioned Cambridge Econometrics (who are also doing work for DSIT on key/priority clusters) to do cluster case studies in the North. A number of overlapping complementary ecosystems are evident with data showing the importance of defence and security capabilities in Lancashire which also fits with opportunities around Cyber. Next stage is to arrange interviews (Aug/Sept) for the consultants to develop the case study content.
- A £2.3M joint bid (LU, UCLan, UoM, UoL) to the Connected Capabilities Fund to develop spin-out and IP capabilities around Cyber opportunities across key sectors such as aerospace and nuclear, was submitted and we are awaiting news on whether we have been successful. The involvement of Liverpool built on discussions to date about joint work as reported in last period. Our links to MIT also enabled us to build in their input to international best practice on spin-outs and ensure our relationship with them is active.
- On-going input to the NW Aerospace Alliance (NWAA) led Watchtower Advanced Engineering and Manufacturing Plan, this is providing the evidence base and priorities for manufacturing and engineering including the importance of Advanced Materials Processing and Net Zero solutions, with detailed information about key challenges and opportunities. The NWAA are expected to publish the report in the Autumn which will inform work and underpin the case for further bids that tie across the regions supply chain and stakeholders.

Update from Dan:

- Success of the FHundED program, we had about 30 startups in attendance from across the county. We are currently working with Rory to get plenty of founders to the first learning day on the 26th of September
- I've taken on Lekhana and she has hit the ground running. Her focus is fully on Lancashire Digital Hub. She has organised our tech talks for September (Burnley), October (Leyland) and November (Blackpool). She is also reaching out to founders to get them involved in FHundED
- I have active conversations this month with West Lancs Borough and Burnley around supporting them to build their own micro-ecosystem. Lekhana will also be focussing in particular on Preston.
- In the pipeline for New Year FHundED in either Burnley or Chorley. Also looking to deliver 3 x Business Model Canvas/Startup Workshops in 2024. I have found a delivery partner who we will contract for this.

Update from Rory:

- Launched FHundED with 70 people attending and Funds from Edinburgh, Leeds, Liverpool and Manchester
- Brought Funding/Investment readiness activity to Lancaster by Praetura and Natwest (delivering)
- Brought in lots of enquiries from Manchester based Funds about Lancashire investment opportunities
- Lancashire was included as a place in the latest Dealmakers article from Preseed Now

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A regular monthly meeting between public sector, universities, and UK Govt recently came to an end because of government cuts. UCLan have agree to pick up administration for this meeting, and after discussions with LCC, we are proposing to combine this meeting with a proposal in the original Lancashire Innovation Plan report, to hold regular operational Innovation Plan meetings. We would propose this includes all the existing members of the original meeting, plus the delivery leads for the Innovation Plan actions. Interviews and and offer have been made for the Co-Working Manager (0.6FTE) role, allowing the Community Manager to be freed up for more start-up pitching development work. Advertisements due in September for the following roles: -Innovation Engagement Manager -Monitoring and Project Co-ordination Officer -Senior Project Officer (Maternity Cover) (0.6FTE) -Marketing Officer (rehire following the resignation of Gill Millington to move to Growth Lancashire as Business Support Lead) Jobs still in development but likely to be hired in December: -Innovation Engagement Manager (2nd role) -Partnerships Manager -Catalyst Project Manager Note: This reporting structure will evolve once we hire our Monitoring officer.
