Brief Summary

This report presents an application from an organisation requesting £480 towards instruments, song books and promotional leaflets from the Champion for Older People budget.

Recommendation

That consideration be given to the request for grant funding as set out in this report.

Detail

The role of Champion was first established in 2002 and the county council currently has six Champions, whose role is to support the Leader and individual Cabinet Members within their remits.

The six county council Champions are as follows:

- Armed Forces and Veterans
- Disabled People
- Mental Health
- Older People
- Parishes
- Young People

For the financial year 2023/24, each Champion has been given an annual allocation of £10,000 for use at their discretion to finance their activities, to which any unspent balance up to a maximum of £2,500 from the previous financial year could be added,

giving a maximum budget of £12,500 in any one financial year. The Champion for Older People total budget is set out in the financial section of the report.

As their group is growing they would like to purchase

- More instruments to add to our singing sessions
- Print some songbooks for our performance at Grimsargh Field Day
- Print some promotional leaflets to distribute to those who would benefit from attending our sessions

Their leaflets will be printed initially in early April, followed by subsequent batches as needed. Their instruments will also be purchased in April.

They are taking part in Grimsargh Field Day in June, they will print their songbooks in May in order to be able to practice well in advance.

What are the benefits expected to be achieved?

While they attract some people to their service using online means (social media/website etc) there are still many people within their demographic who would only find out about us via paper leaflets and posters. They would like to reach as many people as possible as they know the services they offer make such a difference to the wellbeing of those attending.

Their groups enable older people and those living with dementia to get together in an environment of genuine understanding. The overall atmosphere of their groups is one of fun, laughter and banter, where people can have a go at new activities and share their own skills in order to remind themselves just how much they still have to offer their community.

One of the most popular activities is singing. They are developing that side of their service to meet the desires of their groups. Singing at Grimsargh Field Day will be a great way to celebrate their achievement as well as help their local community to understand that people living with dementia, and older people in general, still have some fabulous capacity and have a lot to add value to their local neighbourhood. We are trying to break through the approach of patronising pity that some of our members still face.
