Brief Summary

This report presents an application from an organisation requesting £1,000 towards the purchase of art and craft supplies and 6 singing to the Brain sessions from the Champion for Older People budget.

Recommendation

That consideration be given to the request for grant funding as set out in this report.

Detail

The role of Champion was first established in 2002 and the county council currently has six Champions, whose role is to support the Leader and individual Cabinet Members within their remits.

The six county council Champions are as follows:

- Armed Forces and Veterans
- Disabled People
- Mental Health
- Older People
- Parishes
- Young People

For the financial year 2023/24, each Champion has been given an annual allocation of £10,000 for use at their discretion to finance their activities, to which any unspent

balance up to a maximum of £2,500 from the previous financial year could be added, giving a maximum budget of £12,500 in any one financial year. The Champion for Older People total budget is set out in the financial section of the report.

What are you going to spend the grant on? Please give a brief outline of the project.

Friends of Pendlebrook run a weekly dementia cafe within Pendlebrook Care Home. This is open to the community and welcomes people living with dementia and their carers. They have been running for 18 months and the group is well attended with an average of 20 people per week. They offer chat, advice, friendship, crafts, information, refreshments and entertainment.

They would spend the grant on art and craft supplies over the next 6 months and 6 sessions of Singing for the Brain at £90 a session (1 per month)...

Date of your project / event or the purchase of goods

The group runs weekly and the grant will cover the costs for 6 months up to July 2024.

What are the benefits expected to be achieved?

The dementia cafe has a wide range of benefits. It is a warm and safe space for people to attend. It offers social connections for attendees where people living with dementia can connect with others in similar situations. This can combat feelings of isolation and loneliness which are common among those living with the condition Attendees receive support and understanding, they form friendships with others who understand what its like to live with dementia or care for some one with dementia. They are able to share experiences and cry and let off steam in a non judgemental situation. There is a reduced stigma, allowing participation with other who understand dementia and do not care if someone has repetitive speech patterns or unusual behaviours during the session. This in turn boosts confidence Attendees also enjoy mental stimulation from the sessions. Although there is no cure for dementia it is good to stimulate cognitive function with singing well known songs, reminiscing, simple crafts and simple quizzes, all of which help to maintain memory and thinking skills. We also provide information and resources for those who need it and we can signpost people to services if required.

Art & Crafts Supplies for 6 months activities for 20 people £460 averaging 88p per person per week 6 x Singing for the Brain Sessions with a trained singing teacher £90 per session = £540
