In addition swimmers take part in 1.5 hours land work and 2.24 hours gym work each week. The cost of this is £21,500. These costs are partially met by monthly subs and the remainder by various fundraising activities..</i></p>

How have you identified the need for this project in your area and explain how you know this is not being delivered for young people already? (Only applicable if applying for over £2,000.00)	<p>In Burnley there is no squad which delivers the pool time required for young people to develop into competitive swimmers. Generally swimmers will join a swimming club such as Burnley Aquatics, Colne, Clitheroe Dolphins, Great Harwood, Ramsbottom or Haslingdon. Once the swimmers achieve a certain standard and wish to take their training further, they join Bobcats but still remain members of their "first claim club"</p> <p>Burnley Bobcats offers the pool time needed to develop swimmers to enable them to meet their full potential as competitive swimmers, or as biathletes or triathletes. The group are aware that swimmers are unable to access this level of training elsewhere as that is why they join Bobcats.</p>			

	<p>There is a well established need for this level of training which is proven by the fact that Burnley Bobcats has been in existence for over 40 years. The swimming squad was self funding until three years ago when the cost of pool hire was raised substantially by Burnley Borough Council and consequently the squad is now required to raise funds in addition to young people paying monthly subs.</p>
<p>How will you recognise the learning and development young people will achieve through receiving this funding? (Only applicable if applying for over £2,000.00)</p>	<p>This funding will help secure the facilities provided to the young people and allow them to develop healthy lifestyles by taking part in a sport which they can be involved in for the rest of their lives. The young swimmers are almost all at local schools or colleges, the vast majority of them live in Burnley. They work hard, training early mornings before school three days per week, which sets a good example to others and helps to teach them self discipline.</p> <p>Being involved in the squad means that this group have a positive outlet for their energy and provides a safe and secure environment for them to meet every other day. The skills they learn in the pool also help them succeed at school with most of our swimmers leaving us when they go to University, although most return to train with Bobcats during their holidays.</p> <p>The development of the young people can be easily measured in terms of their athletic ability as every time they compete, times are recorded and published on the British Rankings database. Bobcats can measure the number of swimmers who achieve County, Regional and National Qualification times, which at National Championships in July 2013, 54% of eligible (age 12-18) swimmers qualified to swim.</p> <p>The success of this group of swimmers reflects well on the town of Burnley and gets the town's name recognised across the country for excellence in swimming.</p>

<p>How have you identified the need for this project in your area and explain how you know this is not being delivered for young people already?</p> <p>(Only applicable if applying for over £2,000.00)</p>	<p><i>Having built up good relationships with YPS service in Hyndburn, Ribble Valley, Rossendale and West Lancashire, South Ribble and Chorley the group know that Anti-Social behaviour is an issue with young people on the streets. Also according to Chorley and South Ribble Community Partnership 2011 – 2014. Reports on antisocial behaviour in particularly young nuisance and signal crimes are very common in Chorley and South Ribble and amount to a significant proportion of calls taking by the CSP. Whilst incidents are most concentrated in the central, more densely populated areas, because different issues can affect different areas anti social behaviour and signal crimes are considered to be borough wide problems in both Chorley and South Ribble. There are also no provisions for anti-social behaviour prevention in the Chorley area other than 'Aspire' at Clayton Brook with whom the group would like to work in partnership with.</i></p>

During this time, the group have worked within over 3,500 people and over 30 mentors. All mentors used have been from the outside the local authority and the Foundation would like to develop local young BME and non BME talent within Lancashire to contribute to their local, community in the future. Having recruited young people for our previous projects they have recorded that non BME young people have a huge interest to partake in activities alongside non BME young people and vice versa. Due to the other successful projects during 2012 – 2013. The Love Etiquette Foundation has engaged with 45 new young people from Lancashire who were from local schools, universities, unemployed seeking work and employed unable to find work. Evidence has shown that the work has directly helped breakdown fears and prejudice of the unknown. The activities are open for all, which means people from all backgrounds come together to appreciate art and creativity, which is then marketed to all, bringing diverse communities together with the aim to defeat the stereotypes found in the engagement with young people.</i>
