**Rossendale Primary Schools - Data from May 2013 School Census**

The following gives the current position and five year forecast (based upon current numbers on roll, average intake rates and live birth data. They are adjusted to take into account migration rates and new housing expected to come forward within 5 years, as per 5 yr Housing Land Supply). Jan 2018 are projected figures including housing and migration factors.

NB temporary expansion of Bacup Britannia Primary School will partly address the Bacup shortfall. The area is being monitored to determine whether there is a need for further permanent places.

In other areas where a shortfall is anticipated, the situation is reviewed annually taking into account updated information on pupil numbers and progress on housing developments.

Falling numbers in the secondary sector reach their lowest position in 2015/16 before starting to slowly rise in line with the higher numbers in primary schools. By 2023, surplus could reduce to around 35 places. However, this may occur sooner if there is significant housing development beyond 2018. The situation is monitored on an annual basis.
