The feedback on the Agreed Syllabus is positive with interest in purchasing the Syllabus from a nearby Local Authority.

The Syllabus exemplifies many of the elements of good practice set out in the recent OfSTED report into the teaching, learning and leadership of RE (RE: Realising the potential).

OfSTED reports for community schools in Lancashire regularly highlight the high quality of pupils' Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural Development.

The Annual Report highlighted the performance of pupils in Lancashire's schools in RE with results at KS1,KS2 and KS3 remaining similar to the previous years with over 80% of the pupils whose results were returned reaching the expected level.

The proportion of pupils attaining grade c or above in the full and short GCSE course was 73% and 43% respectively. Attainment by pupils taking the short course increased in 2013 when compared with previous years.
