Issues Raised

- Questions were raised on pupil premium and how this is being spent.
- The decorative condition of a Home.
- To explore further any issues and training for staff around Young Peoples mental health and evidence support offered with regards the dangers of substance misuse.
- Issues raised regarding a restraint technique used in a school setting.



Actions Taken

- Key worker and the school have discussed pupil premium at length with the young person.
- A refurbishment programme is already in place.
- Addaction and SCAYT+ presented workshops to the staff team in December 2014 to further the teams development and knowledge base. This enabled the team to enhance the support offered directly to the young people.
- Reports from school were obtained which clarifies the young person's and schools action at the time. This was discussed with the Social Worker and the Young Person.



Summary of Comments

Negative Comments

• I don't think the visit focused on the work we do with our young people or the staff team as none of these areas where discussed. Although there were young people and staff present they were not spoken to. The format did not appear to be followed, therefore the form was not completed.

Positive Comments

- Cllr Prynn visited a Unit twice. Staff and Young People were pleased Sue came back to visit the unit when the children and young people were present. Overall Cllr Prynn found the home to be providing good quality care and support. Staff interviewed demonstrated care and compassion and had excellent relationships with the young people.
- Overall, it was a very positive visit. All areas of priorities were discussed and were achieved with excellent feedback and rating.
