#### 2. Declarations of Interest

It was noted that all members of the Board had been sent a copy of the LEP Assurance Framework for information and had been requested to complete and return a form regarding any declarations of interest so that a Register of Interests could be produced.

No declarations of interest were made at the meeting in relation to items on the agenda.

#### 3. Origins, Context and Role of the Innovation Board

Mr S Pringle, Director from Steer Economic Development, gave a presentation on the background to the formation of the Lancashire Enterprise Partnership Innovation Plan, its key activity areas and how it operates within the wider strategic framework of the LEP.

It was reported that in 2017 the LEP Board had commissioned the production of an Innovation Plan to bring a more informed and structured approach to its existing innovation assets. The subsequent evidence gathering process and development of a plan had culminated in a report to the LEP Board in January 2018 where it had been recognised that a priority for Lancashire was to increase productivity (which was below the UK average) through innovation.

At that meeting the LEP Board agreed that 'By 2030 Lancashire will have positioned itself as a globally connected and resilient innovation ecosystem. The way we innovate will embody excellence and collaboration, feeding through to greater commercialisation, entrepreneurship and competitiveness in our economy. We will have a track record as a centre for globally-competitive knowledge clusters and talent and act as a developer of new solutions to the emerging challenges of our world'.

The LEP Board also agreed an Innovation Plan which included the following five strategic aims and three cross cutting themes:-

- 1. To stay ahead in sectors and areas of work where the County was already world class.
- 2. To create new route ways to excellence, recreating the economic base and creating new USPs.
- 3. To broaden the innovation base and be less dependent on a limited number of larger companies.
- 4. To create an enabling infrastructure for innovation and commercialisation across Lancashire.
- 5. To Let the World Know by telling Lancashire's innovation story better.

#### Cross cutting themes

- Application inspired in our Research and Development and its deployment.
- Excellence in delivery driven by *real* evaluation and learning.
- Collaborating for a competitive Lancashire

Since then officers had continued to build on the research to form a comprehensive evidence base which had informed development of an 'Action Agenda' that had driven delivery of the Plan to date.

More recently the LEP Chair had established a new strategic framework to guide the work of the LEP which was based around the following six priority sectors/growth pillars with cross cutting enabling activity, including Innovation and Commercialisation, built around these clusters.

Advanced Manufacturing
Energy and Low Carbon Solutions
Food and Agriculture
Health
Tourism, Culture and Place
Digital

In considering the report members of the Innovation Board suggested that the given the current level of unemployment in Lancashire the focus of the Board should be widened to include smaller organisations and individuals who would benefit from an opportunity to be innovative. It was also suggested that moving forward the board should work towards making innovation a pervasive characteristic of behaviour in science, public policy and supply chains across Lancashire.

**Resolved:** That the content of the report and presentation given at the meeting regarding the formation of the Lancashire Enterprise Partnership Innovation Plan, its key activity areas and how it operates within the wider strategic framework of the LEP are noted.

#### 4. Date of Next Meeting

It was reported that no date for the next meeting of the Board had been set. Potential dates in late October 2020 and February 2021 were being explored and dates would be circulated to Board members in due course.

#### 5. Exclusion of the Press and Public

**Resolved:** That the press and public be excluded from the meeting during consideration of the following item of business on the grounds that there would be a likely disclosure of exempt information as defined in the appropriate paragraph of Part 1 of Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act, 1972, as indicated against the heading of the item. #### 6. Innovation Plan Delivery - Work to Date

The Board considered an overview of the work done by Officers to date in relation to the delivery of the Innovation Plan and discussed a number of proposed activities for the future including the proposed Marketing Strategy, use of Innovation Ambassadors/Champions and establishment of an Observatory to facilitate monitoring of statistics and success.

The Board noted the resources which the County Council had allocated to promote innovation and recognised that in the future there would be opportunities to pursue additional funding from external sources, including the LEP itself.

#### Resolved:

- 1. That the work to date by Officers regarding delivery of the Innovation Plan, as set out in the report presented, is noted.
- 2. That taking account of the views expressed at the meeting Officers develop specific proposals in relation to the following for further consideration by the Innovation Board.
  - a) The identification of key 'Lancashire' distinctiveness within the 6 key Pillars of Growth in the Lancashire Enterprise Partnership Strategic Framework which will be the main focus for the Innovation Board in relation to economic opportunity and challenge.
  - b) Arrangements for the monitoring the wider innovation programme of work, as set out in the Action Log, via the 'Observatory' and the

- establishment of Key Performance Indicators for measuring success.
- c) The development of a pipeline of potential future projects which will enable the Board to respond quickly when future opportunities to submit bids arise.
- d) The final proposed Marketing Strategy for approval
- e) Specific arrangements for 'Lancashire Innovation Month in October 2020 and how Innovation Ambassadors/Champions will be utilised to promote innovation in the future.

#### **Executive Summary**

- Someone representing the Blackburn area (again ideally an SME to improve our SME membership)
- Someone with a public facing international role

The Board is invited to discuss the vacancies outlined above and suggest potential candidates for the roles or suggest different criteria or gaps in the membership of the Board which Officers can then explore.



It is not required that we fill these roles immediately. If the Board wishes simply to note these vacancies at this stage and hold space on the board for when a more obvious need arises, they are welcome to do so.

#### **Executive Summary**

Following the last Board meeting and subsequent informal workshop, a new piece of work was commissioned to map existing and potential innovation projects across the county. ### Lancashire Innovation Hub - innovative innovation delivering improved health & care



SEED partners bring expertise & resource to the system. Led by our newly formed Provider Collaborative Board, system priorities and needs will be identified using population health data. Lancashire & South Cumbria is pioneering a new combined electronic patient register which will pool all providers data with wider patient information and be the foundation of our population health management programme.

Local 'collaboratives' bringing together QI, R&I and PPI leaders and teams, have been assembled using only existing resources. We are 'pro' organising our existing resources to the 'max' rather than create new. SEED partners will develop innovative solutions based on PHM identified priorities, as well as having a role in evaluation of PHM solutions in our communities, providing opportunities for real-world testing of innovations and improvements in health care before trying to spread them.



Our fully supported pipeline is a UCLan led partner initiative to ensure innovators and innovations have support to progress at all stages of the innovation process. A combination of support packages provided by our universities, business sector partners including our LEP and the Innovation Agency (AHSN) means that clinicians or businesses are always given the necessary support they need to accelerate their innovation to being ready for use. Our pipeline supports national and international innovation and is linked to our business support mechanisms via our LEP.

Intensity and type of support will vary according to needs and the relative priority of the innovation. This is identified in an innovation audit which then positions innovative projects along our fully managed & supported pipeline.

**SEED** Culture **Programme** Adoption & Learning

Research has proven that innovators should be trained in the various theoretical approaches that exist for describing innovations in ways that can better support those adopting an idea from elsewhere to adapt them for new contexts and should be part of the innovator's 'toolkit'. Our Universities already train large numbers of health & care sector staff. This will be supplemented by a programme dedicated to creating an innovation culture developed from a successful innovation pioneer programme that empowered staff to innovate and provided coaching, training and backfill support to free their time to develop.

Our project will combine partners skills and resources around our newly opened **Health Innovation Campus** at Lancaster University. SEED partners working in collaboration will provide a culture programme to enable innovation, spread and adoption from our leaders to frontline innovators. Supporting & developing a system wide innovation delivery by ingraining innovation, change management and collaboration in the work of our providers and wider system partners.

#### **Background and Advice**

Work is ongoing on a number of action points within the Innovation Plan. Two key focuses currently are the Innovation Marketing Strategy and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology Reap consultancy project. The Board will be given a verbal update on both projects at the meeting with the opportunity for discussion and questions.

#### **Innovation Marketing Strategy**

The Innovation Marketing Strategy is a key focus in this financial year for the Innovation Plan.

At the inaugural board meeting in July, a full Marketing Strategy breakdown was provided as an appendix which gives the overarching plan for marketing. Since the last meeting, officers have had an initial kick off workshop to scope how we will



approach the marketing strategy in the remainder of this first year. Board member Jane Dalton also kindly joined this workshop to lend her expertise.

The outcome of the workshop was an agreement to take a case-study led approach as opposed to a key message approach, for this first year, to allow the board to have some time to finalise specialisms and key messages without holding back progress of the strategy.

#### Massachusetts Institute of Technology Reap (MIT Reap)

The MIT Reap programme allows officers and stakeholders to gain insights from MIT on building strong innovation ecosystems. A number of workshops have now taken place and a proposal is emerging which looks at pulling together a Clean Technology Accelerator Network.
