
## **Applebee Wood SEN Unit formal Consultation - July 2023**

There are too few special school places throughout Lancashire and all children should be awarded a place at a school that is able to meet their needs

Not enough SEN places available in South Ribble.

More places are needed.

Although more special school places are needed, it would be more beneficial to use the funding to make the sixth form permanent, children leaving at 16 and then have to find a new placement. For example moving to sir Tom Finny but places are low because they have their own students there till 19 so many 16 year olds are often forced into mainstream college when it would be more beneficial to stay at Applebee wood until their 19... a lot of SEN school that cater for primary & secondary go up to 19

It is imperative that our kids with SEN get the specialist focussed education they require to thrive and that there are enough spaces for all that require them so that those that are already disadvantaged are not further disadvantaged by lack of this provision. I sincerely hope this application is successful.




