Brief Summary

This report presents an application from a local organisation requesting £700 towards new equipment for the scout group from the Local Member Grants Scheme.

The organisation has submitted a multi-division application requesting a total amount of £700 from the Local Member Grants Scheme towards the same project. Requests have been made to each of the following county councillors and a separate report will be submitted to each councillor for their determination:

- County Councillor Nikki Hennessey - £250
- County Councillor Rob Bailey - £100
- County Councillor David O'Toole - £250
- County Councillor Julie Gibson - £100

Recommendation

That consideration be given to the request for grant funding as set out in this report.

Detail

On 16 December 2021, Full Council approved the reintroduction of the Local Member Grants Scheme. Under the scheme, each county councillor has been given a specific budget which they can spend to enhance the economic, social, and environmental well-being of people who live in their division. Following the reintroduction, using powers in the Local Government and Public Involvement in

Health Act 2007, the Leader of the County Council has authorised individual county councillors to take formal decisions on behalf of the county council.

For the financial year 2024/25, each county councillor has a budget of £2000. Each councillor can also carry forward a maximum of £200 that was unspent in the previous financial year. County Councillor Rob Bailey's total budget is set out in the financial section of the report.

<p>Squirrels Section aged 4-6 years need a flag pole, holder to carry the flag in and a topper for the flag.</p> <p>Scout Section need a new flag pole – the old one is worn and shabby.</p> <p>Cub Section and Scout aged 8-10 years and 10 – 14 years need help replacing equipment used for camping. A new gas fridge is required for August, and we are trying to help a couple of Scouts who are finding the cost of the International Camp in August (£400) prohibitive so anything over will go to help their costs.</p>

<p>Squirrel flag accessories will be purchased immediately; fridge will be purchased immediately.</p> <p>Tents will be purchased in September, and the funding for a Scout to come to camp will be immediate.</p>	



How will the money benefit people in the councillor(s) division(s)?

Our Squirrel Section is new for 4 – 6-year-olds and is already proving to help those little ones who missed out on the early years during Covid. To have a flag on a proper holder will give them an identity within our Group and help them to feel more a part of the community.

Scouting is proven to have been a huge help during Covid and beyond for all our young people and to be able to get them outside doing activities and camping has immeasurable benefits to physical and mental wellbeing.

As a Group, we carry our flags once a month into our church community at St. Anne's for a Parade and for community events – St. George's Day, Civic Sunday, Remembrance Parade etc. Our Scout flag pole is very worn, the screw in joining bit doesn't work properly and doesn't sit together. The Scouts are very proud of their flag and take turns in carrying it.

To have a new fridge for camping, to replace our old one that no longer chills food down, will help us to keep food safe when camping.

We always try to include anyone who wants to come on a camp, even if they cannot afford the whole payment or sometimes any of it. We have a couple of members currently attending our next week-long camp, who are struggling with the payments, and we are trying our best to help them.
