

## Meeting of the Lancashire Health and Wellbeing Board 7 May 2024

### Part I (Open to Press and Public)

#### Lancashire Better Care Fund Plan 2023 to 2025

The Board received a progress update of the Better Care Fund support actions taken since the last report.

**Resolved:** That the Health and Wellbeing Board:

- (i) Received the draft 2024/25 Plan and shared any queries prior to the final version.
- (ii) Participated and engaged in the Leadership and Governance workshop.
- (iii) Considered and agreed the proposals relating to engagement and feedback from people with lived experience of services and support funded by the Better Care Fund.
- (iv) Requested that Lancashire County Council and NHS officers collaborate to provide accurate information about activity levels and the number of people supported by all Better Care Fund schemes, so that the Board, in its assurance role, has visibility on the impact of those schemes.
- (v) Requested Lancashire County Council officers approach the North West Better Care Manager to understand whether there is an obligation to detail the proposed and actual position of pooled funding, as part of the Better Care Fund submissions and governance.

#### Annual Report of the Director of Public Health 2023/24

The Board received the Annual Report of the Director of Public Health.

## **Proposal for the 2024/25 Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (JSNA) Work Plan**

The Board were provided with a proposal for the 2024/25 Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (JSNA) Work Plan, which subsequently sought approval from the Health and Wellbeing Board to carry out two thematic joint strategic needs assessment (JSNA) projects during 2024/25.

- (i) The two proposed Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (JSNA) thematic projects for 2024/25:
  - Adults and Older People's Care Needs Joint Strategic Needs Assessment
  - Children and Young People's Joint Strategic Needs Assessment
- (ii) A request to invite senior data professionals from the Local Authority and NHS together to look at opportunities for collaboration and to develop a Joint Intelligence Programme.

## **Director of Public Health Child Death Overview Panel (CDOP) Report**

The Board received the Director of Public Health Child Death Overview Panel (CDOP) report which provided the analysis of cases derived from panels held across Blackburn with Darwen, Blackpool and Lancashire and provided information on trends and patterns in child deaths reviewed during the reporting year (2022/23) and notified deaths (2022/23).

**Resolved:** That the Health and Wellbeing Board:

- (i) Reviewed and commented on the key findings including modifiable factors associated with child deaths.
- (ii) Sought assurance on the progress being made through the Best Start in Life priority workstream.

#### Better Care Fund

The Board received a report which provided:

- A response to the queries raised at the last Board.
- A summary of the 2024/25 Better Care Fund Plan submission.
- A brief update and progress on the three Lancashire Better Care Fund support projects.
- A brief update on the Lancashire and South Cumbria Integrated Care System Better Care Fund review project.
- Governance and role of the Better Care Fund Board.
- A summary of the outputs of the Lancashire Leadership and Governance of the Better Care Fund support project.

**Resolved:** That the Health and Wellbeing Board:

- (i) Formally noted the final version of the 2024/25 Better Care Fund Plan, and its sign off on behalf of the Board by County Councillor Michael Green in his delegated capacity as Chair of the Board.

#### Health and Wellbeing Board Key Priorities - Progress Update

### **Joint Health and Wellbeing Strategy**

The Board were reminded that there was a requirement to prepare a Joint Health and Wellbeing Strategy, to guide partnership working for health and wellbeing improvement, and health inequality reduction. The Board had been working on key priorities for a while now, and these were reflected in the draft strategy.

**Resolved:** That the Health and Wellbeing Board:

- (i) Considered and discussed the draft strategy.
- (ii) Explored including gambling harms in the Happier Minds workstream.
- (iii) Endorsed the resulting draft for wider consultation with key stakeholders, including the constituent Board partners, prior to final design and publication.

### **Oral Health**

The Board received an overview on oral health which is one of the key markers of overall health in the community and contributes to general wellbeing. The report provided some contextual information relevant to Lancashire and to engage in discussion around the current oral health issues in Lancashire, including opportunities to improve oral health outcomes and address dental health inequalities.

- (ii) Identified future opportunities for collaboration to improve oral health in Lancashire.
- (iii) To receive a further update report at a future meeting.

- (iv) Considered what feedback the Board wanted in respect of the outputs of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Lancashire Better Care Fund support project, the Discharge to Assess Diagnostic.
- (v) Requested an update on the NHS contribution of £10m to the Better Care Fund in 2024/25.

#### Urgent and Emergency Care 5-Year Strategy

The Board received a report which presented the Lancashire and South Cumbria Integrated Care System's Urgent and Emergency Care 5-year draft strategy, as set out at Appendix 'A'.



**Resolved:** That the Health and Wellbeing Board reviewed the report and discussed the progress made on developing the strategy.

### **Housing with Care Update**

The Board received a report which set out the lessons learned from the Tatton Gardens Extra Care Scheme in Chorley and provided an update on the work being undertaken to review the process of Disabled Facilities Grant administration across Lancashire.

**Resolved:** That the Health and Wellbeing reviewed the report and discussed the points raised within it.

### **Tackling Gambling Related Harm in Lancashire**

The Board were provided with a report that outlined gambling related harm, its impact, and the current position in Lancashire. It also identified examples of current activity to reduce gambling related harms including support for people with lived experience, and the Beacon Community Trust's Workplace Charter. A systemwide approach is needed to address this public health issue and the report sought to explore how this can be collaboratively addressed as part of the Happier Minds programme.

**Resolved:** That the Health and Wellbeing Board:

- (i) Discussed the intelligence on gambling related harms in Lancashire and identify ways to collaborate on action to reduce harms as part of the Happier Minds programme.
- (ii) Promoted the Beacon Community Trust's Workplace Charter as a way of supporting staff within each of the Board's partner agencies.
