Brief Summary

Recommendation

Detail

On 16 December 2021, Full Council approved the reintroduction of the Local Member Grants Scheme. Under the scheme, each county councillor has been given a specific budget which they can spend to enhance the economic, social, and environmental well-being of people who live in their division. Following the reintroduction, using powers in the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007, the Leader of the County Council has authorised individual county councillors to take formal decisions on behalf of the county council.

For the financial year 2024/25, each county councillor has a budget of £2000. Each councillor can also carry forward a maximum of £200 that was unspent in the previous financial year. County Councillor Mohammed Iqbal's total budget is set out in the financial section of the report.

<p>The grant will be spent on the purchase of equipment needed for blind people to play a variety of blind sports, equipment includes balls with bells in, goal nets, tape and string.</p>

How will the money benefit people in the councillor(s) division(s)?	
<p>There are no existing sports club for the blind in Lancashire. Therefore, the club will benefit all blind people living across Lancashire as it will get them out of isolation, improve their physical and mental health and increase their confidence and self-esteem. It will also create cohesion between sighted and blind people as we're inviting sighted people to come and play blind sports. We have players coming to the blind tennis and goalball sessions from across Blackburn, Darwen, Accrington, Oswaldtwistle, Preston and even Bolton.</p>	
Please give a detailed breakdown of your expenditure for your activity / equipment.	
<p>£11.40 needed per week for three rolls of self-adhesive line marking tape to stick string to the court so blind people can feel their positions on court. £11.40 x 40 weeks = £456. £25 per week on venue hire - £1000 per year on venue hire 2 hours per week. £81 on a goalball ball from the RNIB – six needed = £486.</p> <p>Total requested £1942 £1000 for venue £486 on balls £456 on tape</p>

We have an active fundraising campaign on SpaceHive, that's been contributed to by Lancashire County Council's Culture and Sport Fund. This grant would go towards the reaching of the fundraising total, so we are eligible to receive the council's pledge. We're £3200 short of the target at the time of writing.

We are seeking funding elsewhere and if we aren't successful then we'll continue to seek other funding or order less equipment. The sessions will still run as we collect £5 subs per player per session to cover our key cost of venue hire/coach fee. The reason we need a grant is so we can actually purchase proper equipment for everyone to play properly.
