Summary

Purpose of the Report

This report presents an application from a local organisation requesting £1,000 towards a new iPad and replacement song books from the Local Member Grants Scheme.

The organisation has submitted a multi-division application requesting a total amount of £1,000 from the Local Member Grants Scheme towards the same project. Requests have been made to each of the following county councillors and a separate report will be submitted to each councillor for their determination:

- County Councillor Andrea Kay - £208
- County Councillor Lorraine Beavers - £792

Recommendation

County Councillor Andrea Kay is asked to consider the request for grant funding as set out in the report.

Background

1. On 16 December 2021, Full Council approved the reintroduction of the Local Member Grants Scheme. Under the scheme, each county councillor has been given a specific budget which they can spend to enhance the economic, social, and environmental well-being of people who live in their division. Following the reintroduction, using powers in the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007, the Leader of the County Council has authorised individual county councillors to take formal decisions on behalf of the county council.



2. For the financial year 2024/25, each county councillor has a budget of £2000. Each councillor can also carry forward a maximum of £200 that was unspent in the previous financial year. County Councillor Andrea Kay's total budget is set out in the financial section of the report.

Since Covid we have had no specific funding and we are mainly self-sufficient (paying large rents £10k a year to Wyre Borough and other for use of premises). Members pay SUBS. We have around 190 members and regularly have 100 meeting twice weekly.</p>
