# **GENERAL PROJECT UPDATE**

Welcome to the Summer edition of the CP-IS newsletter. The CP-IS project is making solid progress, we have spoken with 122 out of 152 local authorities and 322 out of over 1230 NHS settings across the country.

CP-IS has been gathering pace with local authority and NHS first wave sites such as Wrightington, Wigan and Leigh NHS Foundation Trust and Calderdale and Huddersfield NHS Foundation Trust Homerton Hospital, Lancashire County Council, London Borough of Tower Hamlets and London Borough of Newham all putting their systems through testing. CP-IS is dependent on NHS Spine 2 go live which is scheduled the weekend of the 22nd August. Our first local authority sites will start uploading data from the 8th September with the fast followers and first wave NHS settings starting to use the solution from the 22nd September.

Tom Burnett, Child Health Programme Manager said:

"We are all excited about the prospect of the first sites going live as the CP-IS team and first wave sites have worked long and hard to achieve this goal, and we are pushing to ensure it is a success especially for the children for which this is the priority. We need the support of the whole country in terms of local authorities and NHS unscheduled care settings, so if you have been waiting to act now is the time.

"We will be reviewing lessons learned from our first wave sites, which will be shared to help inform other organisations on their approach and implementation. Top Tip: Forming a collaborative approach with health partners and a primary local authority in your area is useful in managing implementation and expectations."



# LOCAL AUTHORITY UPDATE

The first HSCIC CP-IS accreditation has been issued to Liquidlogic for their children's social care system developed with Lancashire County Council after successfully completing their final end-to-end integration testing. London Borough of Tower Hamlets with Corelogic, and Newham with OLM are now in final testing phase as well.

For all local authorities that have formally signed up for the CP-IS project via the 'Letter of Agreement', we are expecting a regular monthly progress update. We are supporting these local authorities by sending regular checklist reminders to them, and the CP-IS team is available to help sites with any queries. Please remember to send in your progress update in preparation for go-live!

Most importantly, each local authority's estimated go-live date reported back to us will greatly help the CP-IS project to align the NHS sites as much as possible.

One of the first wave primary changer local authorities that has already developed CP-IS with one supplier, has gone on to put themselves forward to be a primary changer again to develop CP-IS with another new supplier soon. It is positive to know that a local authority is willing to go through the process again twice of developing and going live with CP-IS in such a short time frame.

The CP-IS funded NHS number tracing service for local authorities' CP-IS cohort of children through the National Back Office (NBO) is a one off opportunity and will soon expire by April 2015. We recommend all local authorities notify CP-IS and NBO asap in order to book themselves in to utilise this service as per the guidance on the CP-IS website: CP-IS LA NHS number process (PDF, 565.0kB) - an overview of getting NHS Numbers traced using the MACS service via the NBO.

### **SUPPLIER LIAISON GROUP**

NHS system suppliers have now started to enter the Common Assurance Process. Intersystems, TPP and Adastra have all submitted Gate 0 documentation to begin the process. The next Supplier Liaison Group is now set for the 19th September in Manchester with invites being sent out to all suppliers by TechUK. This will give further information on the CAP process for suppliers as well as highlight implementation timelines and the process for engagement with HSCIC.
