Why map IAG in Lancashire?



- To Identify gaps in provision to effectively target resources.
- To identify and recognise partners who can contribute to the delivery of IAG.
- To inform future bids for discretionary funding around CEIAG/Inspiration/Enterprise activities.
- To develop a robust support structure for schools and colleges to ensure all young people benefit from access to CEIAG and/or inspirational or entrepreneurial activity.

Research Methods



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- Two main methods:
 - Desk based review of online resources .
 - Interviews with 24 individuals representing 20 separate organisations delivering CEIAG/Employability related activities in the county
